

## Recipes From The Reba Cookbook 1957

### Old Fashioned Barley Soup Submitted by Vi Kerr

1 Soup Bone

4 qts. Water

Salt and Pepper to taste

1/4 c. chopped parsley

1 C. chopped celery

1 C. chopped onion

1 C. chopped cabbage

½ c. chopped carrots

½ c. barley

2 C. tomato juice

1 t. Worcestershire sauce

Dash garlic salt

Crack Bone. Cover with water. Cover, simmer for 6 hours. Remove bone. Add remaining ingredients and simmer 3 hours. DO NOT BOIL.

Split Pea Soup Submitted by Dorothy Stock

2 lbs. split peas ½ c. chopped celery 1 large ham bone 1 small onion ½ c grated carrots

Cook on slow flame 6-7 hours. Stir occasionally. Salt and Pepper to taste.

## Spice Cake Submitted by Bud Congrove

2 c. sugar

½ c. shortening

3 c. flour

1 pinch salt

½ c. raisins

2 c. buttermilk

1 T. cocoa

½ t. ground cloves

2 t. cinnamon

2 t. baking soda

Mix all dry ingredients together. Mix in the shortening, then add half of the buttermilk and beat until smooth. Then add the balance of the buttermilk. Pour batter into angel cake tin and bake in oven 30 minutes at 375 degrees or until tester comes out clean.

## Molasses Cookies Submitted by Henrietta Kerr

 $\frac{3}{4}$  c. shortening 1 t. cinnamon  $\frac{1}{2}$  t. cloves 1 c. brown sugar

2 ¼ c. sifted flour 1 egg

½ t. salt½ c. molasses2 t. baking soda1 t. ginger

Cream shortening and sugar. Agg egg and molasses and mix well. Add sifted dry ingredients and mix. Roll like walnut. Coat with sugar. Place on cookie sheet and sprinkle 1 drop water on each. Bake in 350-degree oven for 9-11 minutes.
